
The Acoustic Research Xsight $^{\text{TM}}$  Touch Advanced Universal Remote will change your home entertainment experience forever. You can start using it right out of the box through the guided setup on the full-color LCD touch screen. The Quickstart Guide that came with your remote helps with the first steps.

The CD-ROM included with the  $Xsight^T$  Touch gives you the tools to tap into the real power of this remote through the EZ-RCTM Remote Control Setup Wizard website. Expand and customize features to control your entire home theater with simple one-touch activities like Watch TV or Listen to CD. Create personalized, full-color profiles with channel favorites for Mom, Dad, and even the kids.

This Owners Manual guides you through the remote menus that let you get the most from your  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch.

Before you start, make sure you've found the following parts included in your  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch package:



# GETTING STARTED

The Xsight™ Touch setup has three easy steps to get started:


### 1. Charge the Remote

Insert the battery in the battery compartment on the back of the remote.

The supplied battery comes partially charged, but we recommend charging it for approximately an hour before use. To do this, connect the charging cradle to a power outlet using the supplied AC adapter and place the remote on the cradle. The display will show the battery charging icon.

# GETTING STARTED





### 2. Follow the Remote's On-Screen Setup Routine

Once the remote has charged completely, it's ready to start its setup routine.

To start using your remote at any time, simply pick it up. The remote's LCD screen will come on and the backlight will illuminate.

For more information on the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch on-screen setup routine, see the Quickstart Guide.

### 3. Connect to Your PC for Advanced Setup

Once you've set up the remote to operate your devices, connect it to your PC to unlock its true potential! The *Xsight™ Touch* uses the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website to configure its advanced functionality, such as Activities, Favorites, and Profiles.

See the Quickstart Guide for more information on connecting the remote to your PC.

# TOUR OF THE REMOTE

Your  $Xsight^T$  Touch remote control offers two ways of controlling your home entertainment devices:

- **the interactive touchscreen** gives you the ultimate control over your home entertainment system by letting you customize and simplify your home entertainment experience
- hard keys let you control common device features, much like the keys on your original remote controls

# TOUR OF THE REMOTE



# Hard keys

(Power) turns devices on and off.

**GUIDE** brings up the active device's guide (if the active device has guides, like satellite receivers or cable boxes, for example).

**MENU** brings up the active device's menu (if the active device has menus). For DVD players, it brings up the disc menu.

**INFO** displays information about your video or audio signal.

**EXIT** leaves the device guide or menu.

- + and (Channel) keys operate channel up/down functions in video devices and preset up/down in audio devices.
- ← (Go Back) takes you to the previous channel or menu/guide screen on your device.
- and (Volume) keys increase or decrease the volume.

**Arrow keys and OK** navigate through device menus and guides and choose menu/guide items.

**Red, green, yellow, and blue keys** access interactive functions for cable boxes, satellite receivers, or Blu-ray Disc<sup>™</sup> players (if available).

♠, ►, →, ←, ●, , LIST, ■, and ● (transport) keys operate DVR functions and perform traditional play/pause/fast forward/rewind/record/stop on all other video and audio devices.

**Numbers 0-9** enter digits directly (or text for customizing labels).

**INPUT** selects inputs on your display device or receiver.

**ENTER/-** operates channel enter and 10+ digit entry. For digital TV channels, this key also separates the main channel from the subchannel. For example, to choose the channel 59.1, press "5", "9", ENTER/-, and "1".

# Interactive touch screen

Your remote's customizable touch screens can be set up via the remote or by connecting to your PC. To use the functions displayed, simply touch the screen where the function is. To move between the pages, brush your thumb along the slider bar or tap to the left or right. Multiple pages will wrap around—if you scroll right to the last page, scrolling right again will take you back to the first page.



**Touch screen menu** displays Activities, Devices, extended functions, profiles and settings on the remote's LCD screen.

The **slider bar** scrolls pages on the remote's touch screen.

**Shortcut keys** give you one-touch access to some of the remote's advanced functions:

(Home/Back) goes back one screen in the menus. Holding this key down for two seconds takes the remote to the Home Screen.

 $\bigcirc$  (Favorites) accesses the Favorites screen directly.

(Activities) accesses the Activities screen directly.

(Devices) accesses the Devices screen directly.

# HOME SCREEN




The Home Screen of the *Xsight*<sup>TM</sup> *Touch* is your gateway to the remote's full functionality.

To access the Home Screen at any time, hold down the (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.

The Home Screen of the remote has the following options:

- Favorites
- Activities
- Devices
- Settings (on the second page of the screen—use the slider bar below the screen to access this option)

## **FAVORITES**



The Favorites menu gives you access to your Favorite Channels, which you choose using the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website. You can choose up to 70 favorite channels.

**IMPORTANT:** Favorites and profiles can only be created or edited using the EZ- $RC^{TM}$  Remote Control Setup Wizard website.



You can also use the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website to group your favorite channels for each family member or type of programming. These are called Profiles. For example, you can make separate favorite channel lists for Mom and Dad, or you can make favorite channel lists by genre (like Movies, News, or Sports).

**IMPORTANT:** You must create your full list of favorite channels before you can create Profile lists. The Profile lists are subsets of the full Favorite Channel list.

To access the Favorites Screen at any time: Press the  $\bigcirc$  (Favorites) shortcut key underneath the screen.

This section explains how to choose favorite channels and create Profile for groups of favorite channels.



- 1. Connect the *Xsight™ Touch* to your PC using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. Double-click on the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard icon on your PC desktop to launch.

**NOTE:** If you haven't already installed the EZ-RC<sup>™</sup> Remote Control Setup Wizard on your PC, you can install it using the CD-ROM that came with your remote. See the Quickstart Guide that came with your remote for instructions.



### **FAVORITES**



- 3. Follow the prompts from the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website until you get to the screen shown here.
- 4. Click on the *Favorites* button and choose *Modify Favorites* to start choosing your favorite channels.

# **Creating Profiles**

Once you've chosen your favorite channels for everyone, you can group these favorites into lists for different profiles.

- 1. Connect the *Xsight™ Touch* to your PC using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. Double-click on the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard icon on your PC desktop to launch.

**NOTE:** If you haven't already installed the EZ-RC<sup>™</sup> Remote Control Setup Wizard on your PC, you can install it using the CD-ROM that came with your remote. See the Quickstart Guide that came with your remote for instructions.

- 3. Follow the prompts from the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website until you get to the screen shown here.
- 4. Click on the *Favorites* button and choose *Add a Profile* to start a new group of favorite channels. Choose *Modify a Profile* to edit an existing group of favorite channels.



### TIP

The Profiles feature also lets you add a photo for each profile on the Favorites screen. Just follow the directions in the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website.

### ACTIVITIES



To access the "Activities" Screen at any time: Press the **4** (**Activities**) shortcut key underneath the screen.

The Activities menu gives you access to all of the One-Touch Activities you've set up using the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website.

**IMPORTANT:** Activities can only be created or edited using the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website.


An activity lets you condense a multi-step action to a single touch. For example, you can create an activity called "Watch Movie" that will automatically execute all the steps needed to start watching a movie on your home theater system.

When you have set up your Activity, it appears on your touch screen in the Activities menu. When you press this on-screen Activity key, the remote automatically sets up your home theater for Watching TV, Watching a Movie, etc.

**NOTE:** You can also tell the remote exactly what keys control which devices when you're "watching a movie"-like having the transport keys (play, reverse, fast forward, etc.) control the DVD player but the volume keys control your A/V receiver.

# **Setting Up Activities**

- 1. Connect the Xsight™ Touch to your PC using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. Double-click on the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup



**NOTE:** If you haven't already installed the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard on your PC, you can install it using the CD-ROM that came with your remote. See the Quickstart Guide that came with your remote for instructions.

- 3. Follow the prompts from the EZ-RC™ Remote Control Setup Wizard website until you get to the screen shown here.
- 4. Click on the Activities button and choose Add an Activity to start creating activities.

## ACTIVITIES

IMPORTANT: Keep the remote pointed at your home entertainment devices until you can see the activity has finished and your devices have responded to the remote's commands.

# **Using Activities**

- When you start using your home theater-before you turn anything on-choose the Hello activity on the Xsight™ remote.
- 2. Choose the home entertainment activity you want to perform (for example, *Watch TV*).
- 3. When you're finished with your home theater, choose the *Good Night* activity.

# **DEVICES**




The Devices menu gives you direct access to all the devices your remote is set up to control. Selecting a device puts the remote into the correct mode to control the device selected. If you select TV, for instance, the remote will control your TV.

Once you've selected a device to control, the remote screen displays the "soft" keys for that device. These are keys that your original device remote may have that the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch does not have physical (or "hard") keys for.

Devices can be set up using the remote (via *Device Setup* or *Learning*), or using PC Setup.

To access the Devices Screen at any time: Press the (Devices) shortcut key underneath the screen.



The Settings menu lets you add or delete devices, learn functions from your original remote control, and adjust various options on your remote. The following section details each option in the Settings menu.

# **Device Setup**

The Device Setup menu lets you add or delete devices. This menu also lets you see the individual codes the remote is using to operate your devices.

# Adding a Device

The Add Device procedure is similar to the initial setup.

- 1. Select *Device Setup* from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select *Add Device*. The first page of devices is displayed.
- 3. Select the device type you are adding. After you select a device type, the available device brands are listed.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the device type you want to add, use the scroll bar beneath the screen to scroll through the pages to view more device types. If your desired device type is not listed, you can use PC Setup to search for additional brands, or learn the device from your original remote.

4. Select the device brand. Then follow the on-screen prompts to begin testing the first code.

**NOTE:** If you don't see your device brand, scroll through the pages to view more brands. If your desired brand is not listed, you can use PC Setup to search for additional brands, or learn the device from your original remote.





5. Take the remote to within range of the device and test the first code with your device.

If the device responds as expected, press the on-screen key labeled *Works!*. If the device does not respond, either try a different key or press the function key labeled *Next* to test the next device code.

**NOTE:** If you don't find a functioning code, you can use the EZ-RC<sup>™</sup> Remote Control Setup Wizard website on your PC to search for additional codes, or Learn the device from your original remote.




# Viewing a Device Code

The *View Code* screen shows you which code the remote is using to control your device. This information can be used by Customer Service should you need to contact them.

- 1. Select *Device Setup* from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select *View Code*. The first page of devices is displayed.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the device you want, use the scroll bar beneath the screen to scroll through the pages to view more devices.

3. Select the device whose code you want to view. The remote will display the code being used for that device, along with any other information available for the device (like brand, model, etc.).



# Deleting a Device

You can remove devices from the remote's memory if you no longer want to use the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch to control them. To remove these devices:

- 1. Select *Device Setup* from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select *Delete Device*. The first page of devices is displayed.


**NOTE:** If you don't see the device you want, use the scroll bar beneath the screen to scroll through the pages to view more devices.

3. Select the device you want to delete. A confirmation screen appears.

**NOTE:** If the device you are deleting is in use by one or more Activities or Favorites, the remote will display a warning message.

4. Select Yes to delete the device or No to exit without deleting the device.

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (a) (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.



# Learning

The Learning feature lets you learn functions from your original remote control(s) to the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch. This process can be used to add missing keys or replace existing keys on devices that have already been set up, or even to add a complete new device to your remote.

**NOTE:** Your original remote must still be in working order to learn from it.



# Learning a New Device

- 1. Select Learn a Function from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select Learn a New Device.
- 3. Select the device type you want to learn.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the Device you want, scroll through the pages to view more.

4. Enter a name for the device.

Use the number keys on the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch to enter letters and numbers (like texting on a mobile phone) and the on-screen Clear key to delete the previous character. Press the on-screen OK key when you're finished.

5. Select the first key on the *Xsight™ Touch* you want to learn onto-either a physical key or an on-screen soft key (press *On-Screen Keys* to choose a soft key).

**NOTE:** You can Learn onto any physical or on-screen key **except for** the shortcut keys for Home, Favorites, Activities, and Devices.



6. Locate the remote for the device you want to learn from. Align the **top** of the source remote with the **bottom** end of the *Xsight*<sup>TM</sup> *Touch*, no further than 5 inches apart, preferably between 2 and 5 inches (5cm and 12cm).



7. On the remote you are learning from, press the first key you want to learn.

**NOTES:** If the function is not learned correctly, the  $Xsight^T$  Touch screen displays an error message. Select Yes to try learning again, or No to exit to the Settings menu.

If the key you are learning the function onto already has a function, you will be asked if you want to overwrite it.


8. If the  $Xsight^T$  Touch successfully learns the key, it saves the learned function to its memory.

**NOTES:** If you're learning an on-screen key, the remote will prompt you to save a label. Use the number keys on the  $Xsight^T$  Touch to enter letters and numbers (like texting on a mobile phone) and the on-screen Clear key to delete the previous character. Press the on-screen OK key when you're finished.

To learn an additional physical key for this device: Press the key on the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch you want to learn onto for the next function.

**To finish learning keys for this device:** Press the onscreen *OK* key. (You can come back and learn additional keys later.)

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (a) (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.



# Learning a New Function

- 1. Select Learning from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select Learn a Function.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the Device you want, scroll through the pages to view more.

3. Select the key on the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch you want to learn onto-either a physical key or an on-screen soft key (press *On-Screen Keys* to choose a soft key).

**NOTE:** You can Learn onto any physical or on-screen key **except for** the shortcut keys for Home, Favorites, Activities, and Devices.



4. Locate the remote for the device you want to learn from. Align the **top** of the source remote with the **bottom** end of the *Xsight*<sup>TM</sup> *Touch*, no further than 5 inches apart, preferably between 2 and 5 inches (5cm and 12cm).



5. On the remote you are learning from, press the key you want to learn.

**NOTES:** If the function is not learned correctly, the  $Xsight^T$  Touch screen displays an error message. Select Yes to try learning again, or No to exit to the Settings menu.

If the key you are learning the function onto already has a function, you will be asked if you want to overwrite it.

6. If the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch successfully learns the key, it saves the learned function to its memory.

**NOTE:** If you're learning an on-screen key, the remote will prompt you to save a label. To learn an additional key for this device: Press the onscreen Yes key.


**To finish learning keys for this device:** Press the onscreen *No* key. (You can come back and learn additional keys later.)

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.

# **Volume Control**

Volume Control lets you set a single device to control your entire home entertainment system's volume. For example, if you have the sound from your TV and DVD player routed through your A/V receiver, you can tell the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch to control volume on the A/V receiver regardless of which device mode you're in. So, if you're using the rest of the keys on the remote to control your DVD player, you can still control just the A/V receiver with the volume keys.

You can also exempt some or all of your devices from the volume control—the remote will send volume commands to these devices when in these device modes.




# Locking Volume to a Device

- 1. Select Volume Control from the Settings menu.
- 2. Review the explanatory screens, then press OK.
- 3. Select *Lock Volume*. The first page of devices is displayed.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the Device you want, scroll through the pages to view more.

- 4. Select the device you want to lock volume to. The remote will display a confirmation screen.
- 5. Press Finish.



# Removing a Device from Lock

- 1. Select Volume Control from the Settings menu.
- 2. Review the explanatory screens, then press OK.
- 3. Select *Unlock Device*. The first page of devices is displayed.

**NOTE:** If you don't see the Device you want, scroll through the pages to view more.

- 4. Select the device you want to unlock. The remote removes the volume lock and displays a confirmation screen.
- 5. Press Finish.



# Unlocking All Volume Control

- 1. Select Volume Control from the Settings menu.
- 2. Review the explanatory screens, then press OK.
- 3. Select *Unlock All*. The remote unlocks the volume and displays a confirmation screen.
- 4. Press Finish.

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (a) (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.



# Clock

The Clock setting lets you adjust the time on the remote as you did during the Initial Setup.

- 1. Select *Clock* from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select a clock type: 12 or 24 hour.
- 3. Using the on-screen *Hour* and *Min* keys, enter the current time.
- 4. Press Finish. The remote displays the entered time.



# **Audio**

The  $Xsight^T$  Touch provides audible feedback to confirm when a key is pressed. This section of the settings menu lets you set which sound you want for audio feedback, as well as the volume for this sound.


- 1. Select Audio from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select a tone from the Audio screen to hear a sample beep.
- 3. Press OK. The remote will save the selected tone as the key-press sound.



# **Brightness**

This setting allows you to adjust the brightness of the remote's screen.

- 1. Select *Brightness* from the Settings menu.
- 2. Select a brightness level. The screen will change to display the selected brightness.
  - To view another brightness level, press + or -. The screen will change to display the new brightness level.
- 3. Press OK. The remote will save the selected brightness level.



# **Timeout**


To save battery power, the key backlight and LCD screen automatically dim after a period of inactivity (the default period is 10 seconds). You can view and adjust this timing under the Timeout setting.

- 1. Select *Timeout* from the Settings menu.
- 2. The screen displays the current period of time before the remote times out.

To change the timeout period, press + or -. The minimum timeout period is 5 seconds, and the maximum timeout period is 30 seconds.

**NOTE:** Longer timeout periods mean shorter battery life.

3. Press OK. The remote will save the selected timeout period.



# Language

The Language setting lets you change the Language of your remote's on-screen display. Once selected, all menus and instructions will be displayed in the language chosen. The remote's initial setup allows you to choose your preferred language. If you ever need to change that setting, you can do so in this menu.

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (a) (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.





# RF On/Off

The  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch remote has the capability to transmit Radio Frequency (RF) commands. Used with the ARRE433B RF extender (sold separately), the  $Xsight^{TM}$  Touch can control your devices even if they are hidden in a closed cabinet.

- 1. Select *RF On/Off* from the Settings menu. The remote screen displays the current RF Transmission status.
- 2. To turn RF transmission on, press *ON*. To turn RF transmission off, press *OFF*.
- 3. Press OK. The remote saves the RF Transmission status.

# DIRECTV® RF

The Xsight<sup>TM</sup> Touch remote can control DIRECTV® satellite receivers with RF capability even when the satellite receiver is hidden in a closed cabinet or in a different room. The Xsight<sup>TM</sup> Touch can control DIRECTV® receivers with RF capability without using the ARRE433B RF extender.

**IMPORTANT:** Before you can use the DIRECTV® RF feature, you must set up the  $Xsight^T$  Touch to operate your DIRECTV® receiver just as you have with your other devices (like your TV, your DVD player, etc.). If the DIRECTV® receiver is already in RF mode, switch the receiver back to IR mode to confirm that the  $Xsight^T$  Touch can operate it.

In order to use the RF feature, you must enable the remote to transmit RF commands to the receiver and then pair the receiver and the remote.

- 1. Select *DIRECTV RF* from the Settings menu. The remote screen displays the current DIRECTV® RF Transmission status.
- 2. Press ON to enable DIRECTV® RF transmission.
- 3. Enable your DIRECTV® receiver for RF control (see your DIRECTV owners manual or on-screen setup for instructions). Then press *Next* on the remote's screen.
- 4. Find the 6-digit code assigned to your DIRECTV® receiver (see your DIRECTV® owners manual or on-screen setup for instructions). Then press *OK* on the remote's screen.



- 5. Use the number keys on the remote to enter your DIRECTV® receiver's code. Use the remote's on-screen *Clear* key if you need to erase numbers. Press the remote's on-screen *OK* key when you're done.
- 6. Test the remote's O (power) key and + and (channel) keys with the DIRECTV® receiver. If these keys work, press the remote's on-screen Yes key. Then press the remote's on-screen Finish key.




# Tilt On/Off


The Xsight™ Touch remote has an internal tilt sensor that wakes the remote's screen up when you pick the remote up. You can turn this feature on and off through the Settings menu.

- 1. Select *Tilt On/Off* from the Settings menu. The remote screen displays the current Tilt switch status.
- 2. Press ON to turn on the tilt switch or OFF to turn it off.
- 3. Press *OK*. The remote saves the tilt switch setting and returns to the Settings menu.

**NOTE:** If you turn the tilt switch off, you can wake the remote's screen up by pressing a key on the remote.

To access the Home Screen at any time: Hold down the (a) (Home/Back) key for 2 seconds. Pressing this key once takes you back one screen.





# **About**

The About screen tells you which version of software the remote is using as well as other information about the technology used in the remote.

To access the About screen: Select *About* from the Settings menu. The first About screen tells you the remote's software version. Use the slider to view the other About screens. Press the (Home/Back) key to return to the Settings menu.

# Reset

The reset screen will delete all learned functions and labels. Devices, Activities and Favorites you have added will remain in the remote menu.

- 1. Select *Reset* from the Settings menu. The remote will display the Reset Screen.
- 2. Press Reset.
- 3. Press Yes in the confirmation screen to delete all Learning and Labels (the screen will return to the Settings menu). Press No to cancel the reset and retain all settings.

# **Factory Reset**

You can reset the remote to its settings when you first unpacked it. This removes all information about your devices, activities, and other setup parameters.

- 1. Select *Reset* from the Settings menu. The remote will display the Reset Screen.
- 2. Press the 9 8 1 number keys.
- 3. Press Factory Reset.
- 4. Press Yes in the confirmation screen to delete all device programming, activities, profiles and favorites, and setup information (the remote's initial setup program will start). Press No to cancel the reset and retain all settings.


This Quickstart Guide takes you through the steps to set up your Xsight Touch remote to control your home entertainment devices.







# 2. CHARGE THE REMOTE

The next step is to install the Xsight Touch's rechargeable battery, plug in its cradle, and let it charge for 3 to 4 hours.




 Remove the battery door from the back of the Xsight Touch. Press up on the latch to release the door.




2. Place the rechargeable battery in the Xsight Touch's battery compartment and replace the battery door.

# 2. CHARGE THE REMOTE (CONTINUED)



3. Plug the AC adapter into the cradle as shown. Plug the other end of the adapter into a wall outlet or surge protector.

Important: This power adapter should be plugged in so that it stays vertical or lays flat.



4. Place the Xsight Touch in the cradle and leave it to charge for 3-4 hours.

When you set up the remote, you'll need to know the brands of your devices. You can save time by getting this information beforehand.

Use this chart to note the brand of each device so that you'll have it handy when the remote asks.

Note: You can also write down the model number for either the device itself or the remote control that came with the device. This information might help later on for troubleshooting (for example, if some commands don't work the way you'd expect). However, you don't need to know the model number to program the remote—just the brand.



# 3. SET UP THE REMOTE

Once the remote has charged, pick it up from its cradle. The Xsight Touch has sensors that wake the LCD screen up automatically (you can also wake it up by pressing a key).

The Xsight Touch has screens that guide you through the initial setup process.



**To select an item:** Press that item on the remote screen.



To move to another page or screen: Move your finger across the scroll bar below the screen.


In the first part of the on-remote setup, you'll set the following:

- your preferred language (probably English)
- where you live (North America)
- your clock preference (12- or 24-hour)
- the current time

To enter the time, press *Hour* and *Min*. Press Finish when you're done.



The next few screens take you through a quick tutorial to get you familiar with the touch screen. Use the scroll bar to go through the screens.



After the tutorial, the remote asks if you...

- are ready to get set up? (press Let's Begin!)
- if you want to add devices now? (press Remote)



The remote takes you through the following steps to set up devices:

- select the type of device you want to control
- · select that device's brand
- test each code for that brand of device to see which works the best

Note: You can also set up devices through the advanced setup on your computer.

### Tips for setting up devices:

- Always point the remote directly at the device you're trying to control.
- It may take a few seconds for your device to respond to a command (especially on or off). Be patient between presses—give your device a few seconds to respond.
- Some brands of devices do not use a POWER key to turn the device on or off. Instead they use separate POWER ON and POWER OFF keys. Check your devices' original remotes to see if any of them have these separate power keys. If they do, use other keys (volume, channel, or number keys) to test codes in this step.

### 3. SET UP THE REMOTE (CONTINUED)



Once you have set up the remote to control your devices, you will be asked if you wish to set a device as the Master Volume control. This feature is useful if you always change volume using the same device, say for example an A/V Receiver.


### 4. CONNECT TO PC

Once you've set up the remote to operate your devices, connect it to your PC to unlock its true potential! The Xsight Touch uses the EZ-RC web setup wizard to configure its advanced functionality, such as Activities, Favorites, and Profiles.

Before you get started, make sure your computer satisfies the following system requirements:

- Windows XP (SP3 or later) / Windows Vista
- USB 2.0 port
- · CD-Rom drive
- Internet connection

### To connect to your PC:



- Insert the CD-ROM that came with your Xsight Touch into your PC.
- 2. Follow the CD-ROM's on-screen instructions to get started.

Note: The first time you access the EZ-RC web setup wizard, you will need to register so that you can save your remote's settings.

3. Connect the remote when prompted, using the included USB Cable.





- 4. In the first EZ-RC screen after you've connected your remote, check the *Upload* and edit a setup from your remote option. Then confirm that you want to proceed. This tells the EZ-RC wizard that you want to use the settings you created during the on-remote setup.





# How do you turn these devices on?

# Connect your remote to EZ-RC and create the activity.



Double-click on the EZ-RC icon on your PC's desktop. Then follow the prompts until you get to the screen shown here.

#### To add your activity:

- Choose Activity. Then choose Add an activity from the popup box.
- 2. Read the instructions in the next screen and click Next.
- In the Setup Activity screen, choose the activity type that comes closest to what you want this activity to do. In our example case, we'll pick Watch Movie.


